



# The Athens Flat

Another one in a series of luxury flats designed by Head Architect and Co-founder of Formvision Luxury Department, **Milica Gruban** fits perfectly into the aesthetic of Building International



**T**he Athens Flat was inspired by Greek culture, the influence of which can be seen from the Doric pillars to the fine patterns characterized by ancient Greece and warm greenery enriching the coast of the Mediterranean sea. Such architectural elements can best be seen on the temple of Parthenon on the Athenian Acropolis with strong constructions enduring centuries and timeless, elegant details leaving thousands of people in awe. The space is dominated by a stone wall, enhancing the feeling of spatial clarity all the while adding texture and contrasting the tones of beige and black interior. This combination of black, white and neutral colors contributes to the look of a refined style and maintains the feeling of nature.



The travertine, as well as the tones of beige and black, fit in with it and together form into a refined but powerful style. The tones of brown and beige give off warmth and fit perfectly with the created contrast, achieving spatial dynamics. The kitchen is mainly covered in oak tree, painted in black matt color. To achieve a balance between open and closed space, we made a connection between glass pieces and the trivertine slab. The emphasis is put on the bar made out of travertine with motives of Greek style pillars and the neutral color of calm beige stone.





The **Colección Alexandra** bar stools were the perfect fit to the interior, contributing to the grace of the kitchen space working with its simplicity, connecting in to the other rooms. The spatial monotony is broken in the living room, the epitome of luxury found in nature. We introduced golden details, different forms and obliques which work in cooperation with the rest of the colors. For the final touch, we added a pot with Doric pillar ornaments and a signature olive tree, representing the mythological meaning of peace and harmony. The gallery follows the simplicity in terms of colors, as well as in the living room, to highlight the paintings from **Danijela Gruban's** Entropy collection which gild the wall and add contrast to the space. The bloom armchairs from the collaboration of Colección Alexandra and the designer **Soraya Pla** provide comfort and amazement at the highest level.

In the bedroom there is a greater contrast between the elements; an integrated stone wall, as well as details such as busts that characterize the Greek style, connect this room with the rest of the apartment. What differs this room from the rest are the sharp features of the furniture, as well as more often use the black elements of the furniture itself. The bed is especially emphasized by the insertion of leather material, giving it a bold and modern touch.
